

**District 3-5A
Policy Book
2011-2012**

SECTION 100: DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

100.1 The District shall be composed of AAAAA schools as designated by the University Interscholastic League. The Schools that will make up the District are Abilene High and Abilene Cooper, Midland High and Midland Lee, Odessa High and Odessa Permian and San Angelo Central.

100.2 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

100.21 The executive Committee shall be composed of the High School Principals or their designated administrators from the participating schools. There will be 7 voting members.

100.22 Each participating school shall have one vote.

100.3. DISTRICT CHAIRMAN

100.31 The District Executive Committee of District 3-5A shall select a chairman to serve for the first two school years of the realigned District 3-5A. The District Chairman shall serve two years or until the current 7 team district is dissolved by the UIL. The District Chairman shall be replaced if the majority of the members vote to vacate the position. The District Executive Committee and the District Chairman shall govern all Interscholastic League inter-school activities.

100.32 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DISTRICT CHAIRMAN

1. Call all regular, special and emergency meetings of the District Executive Committee.
2. Be responsible for all funds collected by the District Executive Committee and issue all checks.
3. Be responsible for the purchase of all awards for all district contests as directed by the District Executive Committee.
4. Collect and make all assessments to cover the expenses of the District Executive Committee.
5. Issue District Passes.
6. Approve all transfers when correct UIL transfer forms are properly completed according to UIL C&CR regulations.
7. Report all penalties to the UIL office.
8. Certify to the UIL, the District 3-5A playoff representatives in each area of competition as it occurs and in accordance with the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules.
9. Preserve and maintain the records of the District Executive Committee.
10. Prepare and distribute minutes of each meeting and district policy amendments in a timely manner.
11. Appoint committees and make studies and recommendations as deemed necessary.
12. Be familiar with the duties of the District Executive Committee, as prescribed in the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules.

100.33 The District Chairman is a non-voting member of the District Executive Committee.

100.4 MEETINGS

100.41 There shall be two District Executive Committee meetings with the time and place designated by the District Chairman. One will be held prior to the start of school and the other will be held in January or February depending on Realignment. **Special Meetings may be called if needed.**

100.42 An agenda will be sent to district members two weeks prior to the meetings. No action can be taken on items not so listed without the unanimous approval of the District Executive Committee.

100.43 All other meetings shall be called by the District Chairman by notifying all member schools.

100.44 Meetings are to be open meetings. Any member of the committee may ask for an executive session at any time.

100.5 FEES

100.51 The District operational fee will be assessed as needed. District fees for **2011-2012 will be \$2.000 for each of the seven schools and \$1.000 for the ATEMS Magnet school in Abilene.** The District Chairman fees will be \$1,000 per school.

100.52 Fees are due and payable by no later than **October 1, 2011.** Fees will be sent to Mrs. Cynthia Halamicek in care of San Angelo Central High School, 100 Cottonwood, San Angelo Texas 76901.

SECTION 200: SPORTSMANSHIP

200.1 In an effort to promote and encourage sportsmanship, a most important ingredient of scholastic competition, the District Executive Committee has adopted the Sportsmanship Code and the Sportsmanship Awards.

200.12 SPORTSMANSHIP CODE

200.13 Let us resolve that we, the member schools of District 3-5A, will be united in our efforts to promote good sportsmanship. In all Interscholastic League contest. Our purpose is to promote better relationships among students and adult fans, and to promote friendly rivalry between the schools in the District.

200.14 We will cooperate with each other by observing both the University Interscholastic League rules and local rules for the conduct of each contest.

200.15 We will practice fair play in both reality, spirit, and according to the rules as interpreted by the officials.

200.16 We will practice the golden rule: “do unto others as you would have them do unto you”. We will treat our opponents as guests and friends by providing information for their comfort and welfare.

200.17 We will maintain a courteous attitude at all times during and after all interschool activities. We will respect the rights of others, the officials, the school song, the national anthem, and the prayer or “moment of silence” when they are used for a contest.

200.2 ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

200.21 All varsity athletes with a 90 average or equivalent will be designated as members of District 3-5A All –District Team. The cumulative GPA at the end of the most recent semester will be used for students in grades 10-12. Freshmen students will be evaluated based on the cumulative GPA after the most recent grading period.

200.22 Principals will determine what athletes meet the guideline and will issue District 3-5A Certificates to these individuals at the end of the year. Principals will also submit the names of the athletes that are recognized to the District Chairman so they can be recognized by the District Executive Committee.

200.23 Principals may request the Certificates from the District Chairman. Each School will be responsible for filling out the certificates and issuing the certificates to the athletes.

SECTION 300 FOOTBALL

300.1 SCHEDULE

300.11 The District Executive Committee will adopt the football schedule for a two year period.

300.12 A Junior Varsity schedule will be played with the Junior Varsity teams playing the same week as the varsity teams and opposite the varsity site.

300.13 A District Champion will not be declared in Junior Varsity Football.

300.14 All District Varsity football games that shall be played on Thursdays will be at 7:00 pm. Friday games will be played at 7:30 pm and Saturday game times will be determined by the Athletic Directors of the schools that will be playing.

300.15 In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. **Varsity Games that require a change of Date must be approved by the District Executive Committee. All Sub-varsity Games that require a change of Date will be approved by the District Athletic Directors.** Games that require only a time change do not need the approval of the District Executive Committee but the District Chairman must be notified and notification will be sent out to all District administrators and coaches. (Games that require a change in date must be re-scheduled for the next available playing date).

300.2 DETERMINING DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP

300.21 The team with the best won/lost record in District play will be the District Champion. The team with the second, third, and fourth best won/lost record in district play shall represent the district in the playoffs. If two or more teams are tied for the district championship, the teams involved in the tie shall be declared co-champions.

300.22 DETERMINING PLAYOFF REPRESENTATIVES

300.23 Determine the top four teams. Place the two largest of the four in the Division I bracket and place the remaining two schools in the Division II bracket according to the order of finish of these two schools

300.24 In the event of ties, the following tie breaking procedure will be used.

TWO TEAM TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

- (1) Head-to-head

MULTIPLE TEAM TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

- (1) Head-to-head
- (2) Positive and Negative Points

The multiple tie breaking procedures will be used only to determine the four playoff representatives. Once the top four teams are identified, the largest two schools will be placed in the Division I bracket and the two smaller teams will be placed into Division II bracket. **The two team tie breaker procedure will be used for placement in the playoff brackets.**

If 4 or more teams tie for first place in the district race the following procedure will be used to determine the four playoff representatives:

or

If 4 or more teams tie for 2nd place in the district race the following procedure will be used to determine 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place representatives:

or

If 3 or more teams tie for 3rd place in the district race the following procedure will be used to determine the 3rd and 4th place playoff representatives:

or

If 3 or more teams tie for 4th place in the district race the following procedure will be used to determine the 4th place playoff representative:

1. Head-to-Head: If one team has beaten all the teams involved in the tie, that team shall advance. If only two teams remain tied, head-to-head results shall prevail. If a multiple team tie still remains, the multiple team tie breaking procedure will be used considering only the teams remaining tied. Once multiple teams have entered into the positive/negative point tie breaking system, they will remain in the system until all places are settled or unbreakable points are established. (The teams will not revert back to head-to-head once one team has been placed and two remain. The point system will still be used.)
2. Positive and Negative Points: In a multiple team tie that cannot be determined by head-to-head competition the positive/negative point system will be used. In a multiple tie of 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place, representatives will be determined by positive and negative points.
3. If there is an unbreakable tie in points among multiple teams, the tie will be broken by a coin toss with the odd man in. Once that one is selected, then the tie breaking system goes back to: (a) head-to-head, then (b) positive/negative points and (c) coin toss.

POINT SYSTEM (Positive and Negative Points)

Points are relative only to the teams tied. The tied teams represent a mini-district and points are taken only from games played within that mini-district.

A team may gain a maximum of 12 points per game (0 to 12).

A team may lose a maximum of 12 points per game (0 to 12).

Scenarios:

Four way tie (two loses - two teams must have lost at least one game outside the mini-district):

Team A – beat Team B +7, loses Team C -4, beat Team D +15

Team B – loses Team A -7, beat Team C +4, loses Team D -15

Team C – beat Team A +4, loses Team B -4, beat Team D +12

Team D – loses Team A -15, beat Team B +1, loses Team C -2

Point Totals:

Team A: +7, -4, +12 = +15	First	Small School Enrollment
Team B: -7, +4, -12 = -15	Fourth	Large School Enrollment
Team C: +4, -4, +12 = +12	Second	Large School Enrollment
Team D: -12, +1, -2 = -13	Third	Small School Enrollment

1st and 2nd seed for Small School Enrollment determined by head-to-head of 2 Small Enrollment schools, and the same procedure used to 2 Large School Enrollment schools.

The following scenario would be used to determine the playoff representative in the event of a tie that involves the exact number of play-off positions available:

4 way tie for first: Two largest schools in Division I and the two smallest schools in Division II. Head-to-head would be used to determine division seeding.

3 way tie for 2nd: If the 1st place representative is a large school, then the second seed in Division I goes to the next largest school. The two remaining schools will be in Division II. Head-to-head will determine the seeding in Division II.

2 way tie for 3rd: The 1st and 2nd place representatives will determine the seeding of the two remaining schools. EX: If the 1st and 2nd place teams are Division I, then the 2 tied teams will be in Division II and head-to-head determines seeding.

300.3 OFFICIAL FOOTBALL

300.31 The ball must be in compliance with “The National Collegiate Athletic Association Football Rules”.

300.4 ELIGIBILITY

300.41 Rosters: Each school shall submit a copy of its eligibility roster to the UIL office and District Chairman prior to playing its first Contest.

300.42 Supplementary eligibility lists shall be submitted to the UIL office and District Chairman as players are added to the team.

300.43 Only players who have remaining eligibility will be permitted to participate on Sub-varsity teams

300.44 Eligibility Cases: Cases involving questions of eligibility of players should be presented in writing to the District Chairman. Coaches should make sure that the proper UIL form is used and should assist the athlete and his parents in filling out the form.

300.45 The District will adhere to the UIL Transfer Rule with eligibility approved depending upon the filing of signed release forms with the District Chairman.

300.5 ADMISSION POLICIES

300.51 TICKET PRICES

300.52 Reserve-seat section tickets will be priced at \$7.00 each when purchased prior to the season's first game. The cut off selling date will be established by each school, but sales at the \$7.00 price must close prior to the first game.

Reserve-seat ticket prices each week will be **\$8.00. (Only tickets for the game to be played that week can be sold. No tickets for future games will be on sale).**

Tickets sold at the gate on game night will be **\$10.00** each for both adults and students.

Student pre-game tickets will be \$4.00 each when bought at school. (Student Section)

Student tickets bought at the gate on game night will be **\$10.00**. (Student Section)

300.53 All sub-varsity (grades 9-12) ticket prices will be **\$3.00** for students and **\$5.00** for adults.

300.54 All middle school (grades 6-8) and elementary school (grades 1-5) ticket prices will be \$1.00 for students and \$2.00 for adults.

300.55 All ticket sales will be maintained by the home team.

300.6 PASSES

300.61 Football players, bands, cheerleaders, pep squad, and drill teams as organized school supervised groups, in uniforms, shall be admitted to District games without a ticket.

300.62 The working press, radio men, game officials, coaches, team doctor and people who are working at the game (ushers, ticket sellers, ticket takers, those working in concessions, electricians, etc.) shall be admitted to District Football games without tickets. Adults that have been assigned to supervise students (band sponsors, cheerleader sponsors, bus drivers) will also be admitted free.

300.63 All complimentary tickets are to be paid for by the individual schools.

300.64. Tickets for visiting School. The District shall adhere to current UIL rules.

300.65 Sideline passes will be available by the home team for individuals that might be on the side-line during games, (photographers, band sponsors etc.) Each school will be issued 20 passes and may request more if needed. These passes must be worn and be visible at all times.

300.7 DISTRICT PASSES

300.71 The District Chairman will issue a District 3-5A Pass (100 per School) to the Athletic Directors who intern will issue them to School Principals, Administrators and coaches.

300.72 District Passes will read "**Cardholder, Spouse, and Children**"

300.73 Football scouts will not need tickets or passes. Scouts are to report to the tickets booth on the home side of the stadium. They will be allowed to enter and will be admitted to the Home Press Box. They will be ask to sign in at the Press Box

300.8 **STADIUM POLICIES**

300.81 Pre-game

- a. The playing field is to be kept cleared from one hour prior to the game for players to warm up.
- b. The following sequence of events for pre-game ceremonies will be followed prior to kickoff. The clock operator will start the game clock at 6:30 PM to count down 60 minutes to the 7:30 PM kickoff. The pre-game activities schedule will be:

Pregame activities concluded

7:00 -- UIL pre-game comments by game announcer

7:02 -- Exchange of gifts and other student activities (if any)

7:10 -- Visiting team school song

7:14 -- Home team school song

7:18 -- NATIONAL ANTHEM

7:23 -- Coin Toss

7:30 -- Kickoff

- c. It will be the responsibility of the Principal of the host school to see that the visiting school gets a pre-game agenda (if deviating from the pre-game ceremonies listed above) seating arrangements, stadium plan, and special arrangements no later than Tuesday of the week of of the game, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon.

300.82. **HALF-TIME ACTIVITIES**

- a. The half-time interval will be 28 minutes (UIL rule). The referee will notify both coaches at least four minutes before the start of the second half.
- b. Bands and pep squads must divide the time equally for half-time performance time. Each band has 13 minutes to enter, perform, and leave the field. The clock will start as soon as the field is cleared of the football teams. The timer will not wait until the band is ready to begin. The time for the second band and drill team will begin as soon as the band steps on the field or automatically one minute after the first band leaves the field. Band directors and drill teams will be warned if the maximum time limit is violated.
- c. It will be the responsibility of the principal of each school to see that each band director has a copy of the district operating procedures.

300.83 All violations of the half-time rule must be reported to the District Executive Committee.

300.84 Lines in the Stadium: No lines may be formed inside the stadium by students or adults prior to, during, or after the game except those in uniform.

300.85 Students on the Field: No students or adults shall be permitted on the playing field prior to, during, or after the game except those in uniform, engaged in the game and half-time activities.

300.86 Mascots: No live mascots will be permitted at football games.

300.87 Signs: Durable signs of a positive nature may be displayed at District football games with approval of the game administrator. No paper signs or hand held signs will be allowed. Durable signs must not be mounted with tape of any kind.

300.88 Noisemakers: Air horns (any device that uses air to make a noise that would be a disruption to fellow spectators or to the athletes on the playing field), sirens and whistles are not permitted in the stadium.

300.9 VIDEO SPECIFICATIONS

300.91 Minimum Video Specifications for camcorders and tapes will be:

300.92 Video Tapes: Tapes to be S-V H.S. quality.

300.100 Video Exchange

- a. All video will be bused out 10 days before the game. The video should be in the opponent's possession by 1:00 PM on Wednesday.
- b. The one remaining video will be traded after both teams involved have played their opponents that week.
- c. If no scouts are present for the video exchange, the video will be bused to the next opponent on the first available bus.
- d. All video will be traded via external hard drives. If for some reason the hard drive has malfunctioned then original mini DV's will be traded.
- e. Video will be split by tight and wide folders.

- f. Tight video will be shot inside the numbers. Wide video will be shot from sideline to sideline so that all 22 players are shown prior to the snap.
- g. Video should begin at the break of the huddle and end 3-4 seconds after the play stops. If no huddle, video will begin 3-4 seconds prior to the snap of the ball.
- h. If there is poor video quality, the coach responsible for the video will be responsible for making it right for their opponent.

300.200 ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

300.201 The head football coaches will meet at the site of the district winner on the week following the final district game to select the official All-District Football Tea,. The District Champions will set the time and place for the meeting. This meeting will be held at no cost to the District 3-5A Fund.

300.201 The Head coach and one (1) assistant can attend the meeting

300.300 TROPHY

300.301 The winner of the District Championship will be responsible for purchasing their own trophy. Trophies cannot be awarded to the District Champions on site of the last game.

300.400 DISTRICT BELL

300.401 There will be no District Bell Available for the 2010 Season. Once the District Champion has been crowned and the play-off begin the District Bell can be present at the play-off games.

300.402 The team that represents the district in 1st place will retain the official district bell. When there are co-champions, each school will be allowed to have a bell on their sideline. These bells will be bought at the expense of the individual schools.

300.500 BROADCASTING

300.501 Radio

300.502 1. The Home school will make arrangements for the broadcast of its games by a local station. 2. Feeds will not be allowed to a neutral town.(Neutral town is one other than those involved in the game). 3. Should there be a feed to the visiting town, it must be only to the station or stations designated by the officials of the visiting school. 4. The visiting school shall designate one radio station to broadcast the game from the site of the game. 5. Radio broadcast crews shall be limited to a maximum of four (4) radio booth passes and one (1) side line pass. 6. If the local school makes a charge for the broadcast rights of the game, the local school shall retain the receipts. 7. Radio broadcast rights are granted under the conditions of the University Interscholastic League Broadcast Regulations.

300.503 Telecasting (live or delay)

300.504 1. Live telecasting of district football games will not be allowed unless the game is a sellout and with the mutual agreement on arrangements and fees by the two teams involved. 2. This is not intended to prohibit the telecasting of a film made up of the highlights of games at the end of the season or the showing of isolated shots or a game on a sports telecast. 3. Should a contract be made with a television station for the telecast of a game, all of the conditions of the "University Interscholastic League Broadcast Agreement" must be adhered to.

300.600 OFFICIALS

300.601 Officials will be selected through the referee agreement scratch list method. The coaches must agree on a chapter and then on a referee. The referee will pick his crew with each coach having the opportunity to scratch any official he does not wish to use.

300.602 The order of official selection will be determined by lot.

300.603 The meeting to select officials shall be in January of non-realignment years and in February in realignment years.

300.604 All District 3-5A football games will be played with five officials on the field.

SECTION 400

BASKETBALL

400.1 ADMISSIONS

400.11 Adult Tickets shall be \$5.00

400.12 Student Tickets shall be \$3.00

400.2 OFFICIALS

400.21 Officials for basketball games will be selected from a scratch list, which will be sent out by the basketball coaches. This list will be compiled of a minimum of 30 names from the following official's chapters: San Angelo, Abilene, Lubbock and Permian Basin. The list will be exchanged, finalized, and the officials will be picked from this at the district meeting when All-District teams are chosen. Representatives from each of the officiating chapters will be invited to this meeting. The meeting will be hosted by the District Champions.

400.22 Coaches are encouraged to use Officials from their local chapters. Coaches may not scratch an entire chapter. If conflicts arise the District Athletic Directors and the Head coaches will meet to decide on officials.

400.3 SCHEDULE

400.31 The District Executive Committee will adopt a double round robin schedule with home sites reversed for the second year. The schedule will allow time for playoff ties.

400.4 DAY AND TIME OF GAMES

400.41 District Basketball games will be played on **Tuesday and Fridays**. In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. **Varsity Games that require a change of Date must be approved by the District Executive Committee. All Sub-varsity Games that require a change of Date will be approve by the District Athletic Directors. Games that require only a time change do not need the approval of the District Executive Committee but the District Chairman must be notified and notification will be sent out to all District administrators and coaches.** (Games that require a change in date must be re-scheduled for the next available playing date).

400.42 TIMES OF GAMES

400.43 Game times for Tuesday and Friday

Auxiliary gym: 4:30 pm Sophomore Teams (Boys or Girls)

6:00 pm Junior Varsity Boys

7:30 pm Junior Varsity Girls

Main Gym: 4:30 pm Sophomore Teams (Boys or Girls)

6:00 pm Varsity Girls

7:00 pm Varsity Boys

400.5 GAME BALL

The official basketball adopted for district games is determined by National Federation specifications.

400.6 TROPHY

The winner of the District Championship will be responsible for purchasing their own trophy.

400.7 DISTRICT MEETING

400.71 Basketball coaches will meet the Wednesday after the UIL District certification date to select an All-District Team for 3-5A.

400.72 The All District meeting will be held at the site of the District Champion. Coaches nominate their players, but cannot vote on their own players.

400.8 ELIGIBILITY

400.81 Rosters: Each school shall submit a copy of its eligibility roster to the UIL office and District Chairman prior to playing its first Contest.

400.82 Supplemental eligibility lists shall be submitted to the UIL office and District Chairman as players are added to the team.

400.83 Only players who have remaining eligibility will be permitted to participate on Sub-varsity teams

400.84 Eligibility Cases: Cases involving questions of eligibility of players should be presented in writing to the District Chairman. Coaches should make sure that the proper UIL form is used and should assist the athlete and his parents in filling out the form.

400.85 The District will adhere to the UIL Transfer Rule with eligibility approved depending upon the filing of signed release forms with the District Chairman.

400.9 GYMNASIUM POLICIES (Also will apply to Volleyball)

400.91 Signs in Gyms

400.92 No temporary signs or hand held signs shall be permitted in gyms for basketball games. Permanent signs will be allowed but tape cannot be used to attach the sign to any object.

400.93 Lines in Gyms

400.94 Victory lines can only be formed by players in uniform as teams come on to the court

400.95 Mascots

400.96 No Live mascots will be permitted at Basketball games.

400.97 Noisemakers

400.98 Noisemakers such as explosives, victory bells, air horns, whistles, etc., are not allowed in the gymnasium

400.99 Bands:

400.991 Bands may play only before the start of the contest and at half time.

400.100 INSTANT REPLAY EQUIPMENT

400.101 Instant replay equipment will not be used in district games.

400.102 Radio Broadcasts: (Same rule applies to basketball as in football).

400.103 Telecasting: (Same rule applies to basketball as to football). Telecast of basketball games on the local basis is permitted if the game is a complete sellout.

400.110 DETERMING DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP (Will also apply to all other team sports)

400.111 The team having the highest percentage of district wins shall be declared District Champions. The team with the second highest percentage of district wins shall be the District runner-up. The team with the third highest percentage of district wins shall be the third place team. The team with the fourth highest percentage of district wins shall be the fourth place team. **(All ties will be decided by a coin toss and the winner of the toss will always take the higher seed.) The only play-in games that will be played will involve teams tied for the 4th place position where a team may need to be eliminated.**

400.112 Teams tied for first place at the end of regular season will be co-champions, tri-champs, etc. If two teams tie for first and if either team has beaten the other in both head to head games, then that team will receive the higher seed. **If the two teams split head to head the two teams will determine the seeding by a coin toss (with the winner of the flip being the higher seed).**

400.113 If two teams tie for second or third and if either team has beaten the other in both head to head games, then that team will receive the higher seed. **If the two teams split head to head the two teams will determine the seeding by a coin toss (with the winner of the flip being the higher seed).**

(No seeding games will be played. Seeding will always be determined by a coin flip) Winner of flips will always get the higher seed.

400.114 If two teams tie for fourth, the two teams shall have a one game play-in game and the winner shall be designated 4th place.

400.115 In the event of a multiple ties for any place, **and a team or teams must be eliminated leaving only four teams**, seeding will be determined by looking at the district records of the teams involved. The team having the highest percentage of district wins **within this group** shall receive the highest seed. If the winning percentages are the same then look at head to head games, if they are still tied use the following procedures.

Three-way Tie: A coin toss shall determine the team to receive a bye to the finals, while the remaining two teams shall have a play-in game. The winner of this game shall be designated the first seed; the other team shall be runner-up. The loser of the first round game shall be 3rd place.

Four-Way Tie: Determine the first round of playoff by a draw. The two winners of the first round shall have a one game playoff to determine the first and second seeds. The losers of the first round game shall have a one game playoff to determine the third and fourth seed.

Five –Way Tie: In the event of a five-way tie for any place, a draw shall be used to eliminate one team and the policy for a four-way tie shall be used.

Scenario: 3 teams tied for first with 7-5 records

Team A 3-1 Team B 3-1 Team C 2-2 (Team C gets the third seed)

500.4 DAY AND TIME OF GAMES

500.41 District Baseball games will be played on **Tuesday and Saturdays**. In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. **Varsity Games that require a change of Date must be approved by the District Executive Committee. All Sub-varsity Games that require a change of Date will be approve by the District Athletic Directors.** Games that require only a time change do not need the approval of the District Executive Committee but the District Chairman must be notified and notification will be sent out to all District administrators and coaches. 500.72 The All District meeting will be held at the site of the District Champion. Coaches nominate their players, but cannot vote on their own players.

500.8 ELIGIBILITY

500.81 Rosters: Each school shall submit a copy of its eligibility roster to the UIL office and District Chairman prior to playing its first Contest.

500.82 Supplemental eligibility lists shall be submitted to the UIL office and District Chairman as players are added to the team.

500.83 Only players who have remaining eligibility will be permitted to participate on Sub-varsity teams

500.84 Eligibility Cases: Cases involving questions of eligibility of players should be presented in writing to the District Chairman. Coaches should make sure that the proper UIL form is used and should assist the athlete and his parents in filling out the form.

600.11 The Golf Schedule shall consist of medal play matches played on courses of the district towns. Golf matches are to start at 10:00 am if possible.

600.12 The District Executive Committee shall adopt a schedule and the host cities will set dates for each match.

600.2 GOLF TEAMS

600.21 Each school in the District may enter two five (5) member golf teams in district golf meets. (2 girls teams and 2 boys teams).

600.22 Each school in the District is limited to a total of twelve (12) golfers in district matches. (2 Medalist)

600.3 GOLF AWARDS

600.31 Five medals are given to each of the members of the top three teams.

600.32 A trophy is given to the top medalist and the runner-up.

600.33 A team trophy is given to the top team only for boys and girls.

600.34 The official medals are those agreed upon by the District Executive Committee.

600.4 DETERMINING THE DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP

600.41 The District Champion shall be determined by the low total accumulative score as the result of the district medal play matches.

600.42 To determine medalist and runner-up, all matches will be used.

600.43 If two teams or individuals tie, a sudden death hole by hole playoff shall immediately follow the conclusion of regular district play. (Team play will consist of 5 players from each school team that tied. All 5 players will play and the best 4 scores will be counted. The team that has the lowest score on the first playoff hole will be declared the District Champion and the loser will be Runner-Up). Both of these teams will represent District 3-5A at the Regional Tournament.

Individual play for District Medalist will be the same as team play with two individuals who tie for medalist participating in a sudden death playoff.

600.44 In case more than two teams or individuals tie for first or if two or more tie for second, a sudden death hole by hole play-off shall immediately follow after the conclusion of the District Tournament. (Team play will consist of 5 players from each school team that tied. All 5 players will play and the best 4 scores will be counted. The team that has the lowest score on the first play-off hole will be determined as the winner of the sudden death play-off).

The individual medalist will be determined by the same procedure as used in determining team championship.

600.5 RULES

600.51 Scoring Rules

U.S.G.A. scoring rules will apply in district competition. Each foursome which completes eighteen holes will report to a designated table where score cards will be checked and verified by each player in a foursome under the direction of a coach. After consultation by each player the score indicated on the card will stand. Only nine holes scores and eighteen holes scores will be posted and recorded.

600.52 The host coach shall be responsible for informing visiting coaches of any special playing rules which pertain to that specific course in writing to be given to each player at the site.

600.53 There shall be no visiting teams or individual player allowed to miss any school time to practice on a course to be played during the seven (7) school days prior to a District tournament. Weekends and Spring Break are exceptions.

600.54 All matches shall be played under the United States Golf Association Rules. Contestants may not use caddies or electric carts during district matches. A pull cart may be used. After a player hits two consecutive shots into a hazard, his next shot will be played from a designated drop area between the hazard and the green if permitted by the tournament director. **A player shall pick up the ball and record a score of 9 after the 9th stroke on a hole.**

900.14 The District 3-5A Gymnastics Championship Meet will be scheduled by the host team including start times and dates. The format for the meet will be compulsories the first day and optional the second day. Friday/Saturday meets are preferred to avoid loss of school time as much as possible.

900.2 DETERMINING THE DISTRICT CHAMPIONS

900.21 The District Championship Meet will determine the District Championships for both the boys and girls.

900.22 The round robin schedule (dual meets) will determine the order of rotations for the District Championship Meet. See the chart rotation below. (The district entry form needs a win/loss record space added).

900.23 The Girls rotation is set for two panels of judges, two events at a time.

The Boys rotation is set for three panels of judges, three events at a time.

900.24 The #1 equals the first place teams and #2 equals the second place teams etc. from the round robin competition.

900.25 Should there be a tie: **First tiebreaker:** the team that won the dual meet between the two teams that tied will get the higher seed. **Second tiebreaker:** The average of optional scores in district dual meets added to the average compulsory score of district dual meets will be used to break the tie.

900.26 The rotation format for compulsory and optional will be the same. The team in first place after the compulsories will compete in the #1 position the second day.

900.6 ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

900.61 The “All District Team” will be announced during awards ceremony at the District Championships. The top three in each event plus the all-around shall be the All-District first team. Places four thru six in each event plus the all-around shall be the All-District second team.

900.62 The All-District Honorable Mention team will be nominated, voted on and announced by the coaches at the District Championships. Nominations will be discussed during coaches meeting on the second day of competition. Each coach can nominate two gymnasts. The All-District honorable mention team will consist of a maximum of six boys and six girls.

900.73 Individuals and All-Around may qualify by event even if their team does not qualify.

900.74 A coach may petition a gymnast to the regional meet by following the guidelines set forth in the state THSGCA Constitution and Manual of Rules. The petition must be submitted to the host school of the District Championship Meet at the said meet.

900.8 **DISTRICT DUAL MEETS**

900.81 Refer to the above schedule.

900.82 The adopted dual meet schedule attached does not determine the boys and girls championships. The results of these five (5) dual meets will determine the order of rotations for the District Championship Meet. (900.22)

900.83 In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. They will then re-schedule the contest according to UIL policy. Once the change has been scheduled, the home/host team's Athletic Director must notify all remaining District Athletic Directors, who are then responsible to notify their coaches and Superintendents of the change.

900.84 Meet sites will be reversed each year.

900.85 Exercise (compulsory and optional) will be reversed on odd numbered years.

900.86 Meet make-ups will be scheduled as soon as possible.

900.87 The meet host will provide a minimum of two-hour warm up time prior to competition. **Saturday Meet:** Warm-up at 11:00 A.M., meet at 1:00 P.M. **Friday Meet:** Warm-up at 3:00 P.M., meet at 5:00 P.M.

900.88 Two judges (2 men's and 2 women's) will be provided by the host school.

900.89 The THSGCA manual, page 19, section 1, #6, will be the guidelines for using judges and officials. In all gymnastic meets, there shall be at least two (2) judges, one (1) judge may be used provided he/she is approved by the visiting head coach. The Association recommends that judges from the **Texas Gymnastics Judges Association** for men and **National Association of Women's Gymnastics Judges** for women be used.

900.891 The meet host must notify the visiting school one week in advance if the host school cannot obtain two (2) rated judges for each. The men's and women's competition.

900.892 Relatives of the participants cannot judge.

900.893 Judges must have been out of school two (2) gymnastic seasons before judging meets involving the school in which they attended.

1000.101 Payment to Officials

1000.102 Officials are to be paid \$750. (\$100.00 to the starter, back-up starter, \$75.00 for the four stroke and turn judges and the electronic timing operator.

1000.103 The meet secretary will be paid \$150.00 for setting up the meet, preparing the heat sheets, running the office, keeping the records, scoring and awarding the meet, and preparing the final results.

1000.104 Out-of-town officials (over 100 miles) will have their lodging and meals paid for.

1000.11 CHAMPIONSHIP

1000.111 District Championship

1000.112 The District Champion, in both boys and girls events will be determined by point totals at the District Meet.

1000.12 ADMISSION

1000.121 If the host school chooses to charge admission at the finals of the District Meet, the charge will be: **Adults \$5.00 and Students \$3.00**

1000.122 Gate receipts and entry fees will be used to defer the cost of the District Meet.

1000.123 A financial statement will be prepared and included in the District Chairman's annual financial statement.

1000.13 AWARDS

1000.131 Medals will be awarded to the top six (6) finalists in each event. Plaques will be awarded to the top three (3) boys' and girls' teams.

1000.14 POOL AREA POLICIES

1000.141 Signs in Pool Area

1000.142 No temporary signs shall be permitted in the pool area. One permanent sign (of a positive nature) made of durable material may be located in the team designated seating area or pool area. Tape can not be use to attach the sign to any object.

1000.143 Lines in Pool Area

1000.144 No lines may be formed by students or adults as swimming teams come in the swimming area.

1000.145 Mascots

1000.146 No live mascots will be allowed in the pool area.

1000.147 Noisemakers

1000.148 Noisemakers such as explosives, victory bells, air horns, whistles, etc. are not allowed in the pool area.

1000.149 Bands: Bands may play only before the start of the meet.

1100.1 ADMISSIONS

1100.11 Adult Tickets shall be **\$5.00**

1100.12 Student Tickets shall be **\$3.00**

1100.2 OFFICIALS

1100.21 Officials are to be paid according to the University Interscholastic League pay schedule.

1100.22 Officials from the home team's local chapter shall call all games if mutually agreed to by both coaches. Notification of game officials to visiting coaches should be made 14 days prior to scheduled contest

1100.3 SCHEDULE

1100.31 The District Executive Committee will adopt a double round robin schedule with home sites reversed for the second year. The schedule will allow time for playoff ties.

1100.4 DAY AND TIME OF GAMES

1100.41 District Soccer games will be played on **Tuesday and Saturdays**. In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. **Varsity Games that require a change of Date must be approved by the District Executive Committee. All Sub-varsity Games that require a change of Date will be approved by the District Athletic Directors. Games that require only a time change do not need the approval of the District Executive Committee but the District Chairman must be notified and notification will be sent out to all District administrators and coaches.** (Games that require a change in date must be re-scheduled for the next available playing date).

1100.42 TIMES OF GAMES

1100.43 Weekday games shall start at 5:30 P.M. and the second game shall start at 7:30 P.M. In the event the first game is not over in the allotted time the second game shall start 30 minutes after the first game ended. J.V games will be played at a different site than the varsity games. Starting times for J.V games will be the same as the varsity games.

1100.44 Saturday games times may vary according to the number of fields that might be available. Junior varsity games may be played at a different site than the varsity games. It will be the home team's responsibility to inform the visiting teams about game sites and game times for both the boys and girls games.

1100.45 For the 2012 Season Boys will play first and the Girls will play second.

1100.5 GAME BALL

1100.51 The official soccer ball shall meet the National Federation specifications.

1100.6 TROPHY

1100.61 The winner of the District Championship will be responsible for purchasing their own trophy.

1100.7 DISTRICT MEETING

1100.71 Soccer coaches will meet the Wednesday after the UIL District certification date to select an All-District Team for 3-5A.

1100.72 The All District meeting will be held at the site of the District Champion. Coaches nominate their players, but cannot vote on their own players.

1100.8 ELIGIBILITY

1100.81 Rosters: Each school shall submit a copy of its eligibility roster to the UIL office and District Chairman prior to playing its first Contest.

1100.82 Supplementary eligibility lists shall be submitted to the UIL office and District Chairman as players are added to the team.

1100.83 Only players who have remaining eligibility will be permitted to participate on Sub-varsity teams

1100.84 Eligibility Cases: Cases involving questions of eligibility of players should be presented in writing to the District Chairman. Coaches should make sure that the proper UIL form is used and should assist the athlete and his parents in filling out the form.

1100.85 The District will adhere to the UIL Transfer Rule with eligibility approved depending upon the filing of signed release forms with the District Chairman.

1100.9 DETERMINING DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP (Refer to Basketball Section 400.110)

1100.91 The district champion will be determined by playing a double round robin schedule.

1100.92 The team with the best overall win/lost record will be the district champion. The team with the second best win/loss record will be the district runner-up. The team with the third best win/loss record will be third place and the team with the fourth best win/loss record will be fourth place.

1100.93 A point system will be used in determining standings. Three points will be given for each game won, 2 points for a shoot-out win, 1 point for a shoot-out loss and 0 points for a loss.

1100.94 If this method does not establish playoff representatives, revert to the method used by basketball.

1100.10 **FIELD POLICIES**

1100.101 **Signs on the Field:** No temporary signs shall be permitted on the field for soccer games. One permanent sign made of durable material (and positive in nature) may be displayed inside the stadium. No tape can be used to attach the sign to any object.

1100.104 **Bands:** Bands may play only before the start of the contest and at half time.

1100.105 **Noise Makers:** Noisemakers such as explosives, victory bells, air horns, whistles, are any other device that might interfere with the game and distract the players are not allowed in the stadium.

1100.106 **PLAYER MISCONDUCT POINT SYSTEM**

1100.107 Pre-district player misconduct reports should be in the hands of the District Executive Committee chairman before the first district game. As per UIL rules concerning player misconduct point system, the home team coach has the responsibility to report all point violations to his Director of Athletics. The Athletic Director would then inform the chairman of the District Executive Committee or his designee by the close of the next school day after the incident took place.

1100.108 **District Game Tie Breaker Rules**

1100.109 In the event of a tie at the end of regulation, a shoot-out shall be conducted according to UIL recommendations in order to determine a winner.

1100.110 **Suspended Games**

1100.111 If a game has to be suspended during the course of the game, if less than a half is played, the game will be re-scheduled and will start over from the beginning.

If the first half is complete or the second half has started and the game is suspended, the game will be rescheduled and will start from the point that the game was suspended and the score will be the same as it was when the game was suspended.

(The following is what we had in the old policy book). If first half is complete or second half has started and the game is suspended, the game is over and the team that is ahead is declared the winner. If the game is tied when the game is suspended the standings would reflect that it is a ½ game lost and ½ game won.

1200.13 HOST ROTATION

1200.14 2010 Odessa

2011 Odessa

1200.2 DATE AND TIME OF DISTRICT MEET

1200.21 The District Executive Committee shall set the date in accordance with the University Interscholastic League calendar. The time shall be determined by the host school.

1200.3 ENTRY LIMITATIONS (Teams)

1200.31 A minimum of five participants and a maximum of seven participants shall constitute a varsity team.

1200.32 Junior Varsity teams may compete and a championship may be determined.

1200.33 Entry Blanks

1200.34 Completed district entry blanks are to be sent to the District Meet Director ten (10) days prior to the district meet.

1200.4 DETERMINING DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP

1200.41 The first five finishers on each team will count for the total team score. A school may enter less than five; however, it cannot compete for the team title. A school may enter only one team of boys and one team of girls in the District Meet. The team with the lowest total score will be the Champion.

1200.5 AWARDS

1200.51 The official trophies and medals are those approved by the District Executive Committee. The host school of the District Cross Country meet will furnish the trophies and the medals for the meet. 1200.71 No live mascots will be permitted at the site of the District Country Meet.

1200.8 **OFFICIALS**

1200.91 Meet officials shall be selected by the host school.

SECTION 1300

TEAM TENNIS

1300.1 A coaches meeting will be on the Friday after each (Fall and Spring) state meet at 11:00 am. An All-District team will be elected each time. (All of the above will done with no cost to District 3-5A). Rule changes will be discussed.

1300.11 A first and second place team trophy will be presented at the Spring Meet. The expense of the trophies will be part of the Spring Meet and will come out of the District Operating fund.

1300.2 TEAM SCORING (DUAL MATCHES)

1300.21 A total of 19 matches, 9 boys, 9 girls, 1 mixed doubles, 10 matches to declare a match. (6 boys singles, 3 boys doubles, 6 girls singles, 3 girls doubles and 1 mixed doubles)

1300.22 INDIVIDUAL SCORING (DUAL MATCHES)

1300.23 Matches will be 2 out of 3 sets no ad scoring. If a team has 10 matches, then we will go to a 10 pt. tie breaker for the third set.

1300.3 DETERMINING DISTRICT CHAMPION

1300.31 The team having the highest percentage of district wins shall be declared the district champion. If two or more teams are tied for the district championship, the teams involved in the tie shall be declared co-champions.

1300.4 DETERMINING PLAYOFF POSITION

1300.41 Two way ties will be broken by head to head matches.

1300.42 Three way ties will be broken by the total matches won between the three schools involved in the tie.

1300.43 If still tied:

1. Total number of sets won
2. total number of games won
3. If still tied, go to #1 positions. Team winning most matches at #1 positions will represent District as #1.
4. Continue down lineup at each position until tie is broken.
5. If matches still tied at each position, go through the positions again by sets, if still tied then games

1300.5 SUBSTITUTIONS BETWEEN DISTRICT DUAL MATCHES

1300.51 All coaches will meet the week before District play begins to vote on each school's lineup.

1300.52 Coaches will bring proposed 1-8 lineup to meeting.

1300.53 Coaches will bring all pre-district tournament results and challenge match results to defend lineup choices/doubles teams. Last year's results may also be used in this determination.

1300.54 In case of extending circumstances regarding lineups AFTER this date, a special meeting of all district coaches will be called.

1300.6 SINGLE AND DOUBLE LINE-UPS

1300.61 All positions can only change one position up or down during round-robin district play from their original line-up that was turned in at the before mentioned coaches meeting. Exceptions are limited to illness, injury and ineligibility.

1300.62 In case one of the above exceptions occurs, all positions must move up on the ladder.

1300.63 Players may move from any doubles positions to the mixed doubles positions as long as no other player has been altered more than one position up or down in any other doubles line.

1300.64 If both members of a doubles team are unable to play due to illness, injury or ineligibility, then other doubles teams will move up the ladder accordingly.

1300.65 If a player misses 1 or more matches because of illness, injury, etc., he/she must return to the line up in his former position.

1300.7 DAY AND TIME OF MATCHES

1300.71 Saturday team tennis matches will start at 11:00 am unless both coaches agree on alternate starting time. 1400.11 District Game Tie Breaker Rules

1400.111 Games that are tied after 7 innings will continue until a winner is decided.

1500.1 **DISTRICT MEET**

1500.11 The District Executive Committee shall set the site and date for the District Track and Field Meet.

1500.12 The District Track meet will include 4 Divisions. Boys and Girls Varsity and Boys and Girls Junior Varsity teams.

1500.2 **DIRECTOR**

1500.21 The Director of the District Track and Field Meet will be the administrator in charge of athletics or designee at the member school designated by the rotation.

1500.3 **HOST ROTATION**

1500.31 The District Track and Field Meet will be hosted by member schools on a rotating basis as follows.

1500.4 **COACHES SCRATCH MEETING**

1500.41 District track and field coaches shall meet with the District Meet Director as announced during the week of the meet to make final changes and declarations and assist with setting up the meet.

1500.5 **ENTRIES FOR DISTRICT MEET**

1500.51 Entries for the District Track Meet are to be in the District Director's possession 5 days prior to the meet. Changes to entries will be allowed until the end of the scratch meeting. Any and all changes or additions will be accepted. Example: If a student is left off the original list, the student may be added at the scratch meeting. If an event is left un-entered, the school may enter the slot at the scratch meeting. After the scratch meeting there will be no additions or changes. A student may be dropped from an event(s), but may not be replaced after the scratch meeting.

SECTION 1600 SPRING TENNIS TOURNAMENT

1600.1 DISTRICT TOURNAMENT

1600.11 The District Executive Committee shall set the site and date for the District Spring Tennis Tournament.

1600.12 The District coaches shall set the site and date for the District Spring Junior Varsity Tennis Tournament.

1600.2 Director

1600.21 The Director of the Spring Tennis Tournament shall be the administrator in charge of Athletics or designee at the member school designated by the rotation.

1600.3 Host Rotation

1600.31 2011 San Angelo

2012 Odessa

2013 Midland

2014 Abilene (After this date the Rotation will start over with San Angelo)

1600.32 Certification for entry into the District Meet shall be by school and by individual. Due at seed meeting.

1600.33 The host school will provide balls for the Meet.

1600.4 Draws

1600.41 Drawing for the district meet shall be held the night before the meet begins.

1600.42 Seeding

1600.421 Coaches should bring seeding information for each entrant that they would like seeded. Information should include the following: Fall and Spring record, tournaments, individual/dual matches and win/loss record. Seeds will be a maximum ration of one seed for every four players. Once the seeds are established, every seeded position is determined by lot (i.e. Flip a coin to see if the #1 seed goes on Line 1 or Line 16. #2 goes on the other and flip to see if #3 goes on Line 5 or Line 12; then #4 goes on the remaining line). After the seeded players (and byes if applicable) have been written in, fill in the rest of the draw by drawing names of the remaining players and putting them on the unoccupied lines in the order in which they are drawn, starting at the top and moving downward in sequence. If two players from the same school come up with numbers in the same half, the second player will go to the first open line of the bottom half.

1600.5 Scoring

1600.51 Matches will be two out of three sets, add scoring, and a 7-12 point tie breaker being played at 6-all sets.

1600.6 Rules

1600.61 District 3-5A has voted to use college-style coaching. This means continuous coaching is acceptable as long as the flow of the match is not disrupted.

1600.62 USTA will apply. *Exception:* No default enforced if there is an unavoidable delay of arrival due to transportation difficulties.

1600.7 Number of Matches

1600.71 No contestant or team shall play more than three matches per day and there shall be a minimum of one hour's rest for a team or player between the close of one match and the beginning of another.

1600.8 Awards

1600.81 Medals will be awarded to first, second and third place in singles and doubles, boys and girls. Provide by host school. Medals and Trophies will be purchased out of the District Operating fund and should be part of the Spring Meet Account.

1600.9 Playoff for 2nd Place

1600.91 The loser in the finals will play the winner of the third place match (to determine second place) unless these two contestants (or doubles teams) played each other in the semi-finals.

1600.92 The finals and the consolation matches will start at the same time.

1600.100 Officials – District Tournament

1600.101 Home District School is responsible for officials.

1600.200 Coaches Meeting

1600.201 A coaches meeting will be held on Friday after each (Fall and Spring) State Meet. An All-District team shall be elected each time and rules and rule changes shall be discussed. (All of the above will be done at no cost to the District). Rule and Policy changes should be submitted to the District Athletic Directors for Discussion and to the District Executive Committee for approval.
